TRI CITY SHOW: August 26, 2023, was the Thirty-Fourth Tri-City Wood Carvers Carving and Art Show and Competition, which was held in the Knights of Columbus # 4232 Hall in Saginaw, Michigan. The event was a success with a total of 69 carvings entered in Novice, Intermediate, Open and Master's Classes.

There were thirty-four display tables' additionally seven tables of carving tools and materials were manned by carving vendors. The remaining tables were manned by artists and carvers from Mid-Michigan and represented a whole array of carvings from Caricatures, birds, fish, religion and just about anything that can be carved. Three prizes were awarded to ticket stubs dawn from the drum at the conclusion of the show.

First Prize was a realistic carving of a pair of miniature Rainbow Trout won by John Southern of Bay City, Mi. Second was a framed, signed and Numbered copy of the Michigan 2011 Duck Painting from which a Duck Stamp was created won by Robert Paris of Freeland, MI and the Third winner was C.J. Hite of Kawkawlin, MI winning a Carved Caricature of Santa Claus. On display outdoors on the lawn was Tom Gillman (Rustic Design and Carvings, 989 415-1356) of Bay City, Mi. doing a demonstration and sales of chain saw carvings.

We wholeheartedly, all the volunteers which made this show a success. It was truly an amazing display of what our club is about, and the effort we are willing to put in to provide a quality show and competition.

- These lovable critters are a great way to introduce others to carving. They make great conversation starters. People can't resist picking them up once they see them rolling down the table. They're surprisingly easy to carve and after you get a feel for the technique, you'll be able to create a whole herd in no time.
- I got my inspiration for these designs in 1987. I was teaching a woodcarving seminar in Anchorage, Alaska. One of the students brought in a small bear that was carved so that when you put it on a flat surface and nudged it from behind, it would roll over and land face up. I thought this was an interesting idea and developed a number of carved animals that would do the same thing. I hope you enjoy this project as much as I did!

• Materials:

• Basswood: 2" x 3" x 3 1/2" (51mm x 76mm x 89mm)

• Acrylic paint: black, white, red

• Paintbrushes of choice

Tools:

• #5 fishtail gouge: 13mm

#5 gouge: 22mm#11 veiner: 6mm45° V-tool: 10mm

Detail knife

• Woodburner with fine tip (optional)
